

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) is a program that provides funds to help address transportation safety needs in our communities.

Etowah County along with the Cities of Attalla, Glencoe, Hokes Bluff, Rainbow City, and Southside have received an SS4A grant to prepare a Safety Action Plan to help reduce fatal and serious injuries on our roads.



Why is a Safety Action Plan needed?

Between 2020 and 2024, **13,894 crashes occurred on public roadways in Etowah County.** These crashes resulted in 84 fatal crashes, 471 suspected serious injury crashes, 1,079 non-incapacitating injury crashes, and 1,248 possible injury crashes. In addition, there were 10,673 property damage-only crashes and 339 crashes of unknown severity reported.
